For you guys and gals who only want to shoot the hunter class we are now offering your own state 3-D patch.

**Important Information State 3-D
championships**

New for 2002! You must shoot **all three** of the tournaments to be eligible for the award and the winner in each class will be determined by the total score from all three tournaments. As you know, in the past we have only required a shooter to score 2/3. **So remember that all three scores count.**

**Hunter Class 3-D State
Champion**

Wow, here is big news. The SCAA board of Directors during their fall 2001 board meeting, approved this class to shoot for a state 3-D championships.

1. You must be a member of the SCAA/NFAA.
2. You must compete in **all three** of the tournaments.
3. Your equipment shall: be the same as the NFAA with the exception of :
 - a. stabilizer no longer than 12 inches

Hall of Fame

57 Cents

A sobbing little girl stood near a small church from which she had been turned away because it "was too crowded." "I can't go to Sunday School," she sobbed to the pastor as he walked by. Seeing her shabby, unkempt appearance, the pastor guessed the reason and, taking her by the hand, took her inside and found a place for her in the Sunday School Class.

The Child was so touched that she went to bed that night thinking of the children who have no place to worship Jesus. Some two years later, this child lay dead in one of the poor tenement buildings and the parents called for the kind-hearted pastor, who had befriended their daughter, to handle the final arrangements. As her poor little body was being moved, a worn and crumpled purse was found which seemed to have been rummaged from some trash dump.

Inside was found 57 cents and a note scribbled in childish handwriting which read, "This is to help build the little church bigger so more children can go to Sunday School."

For two years she had saved for this offering of love. When the pastor tearfully read that note, he knew instantly what he would do. Carrying this note and the cracked, red pocketbook to the pulpit, he told the story of her unselfish love and devotion. He challenged his deacons to get busy and raise enough money for the larger building.

But the story does not end there! A newspaper learned of the story and published it. It was read by a Realtor who offered them a parcel of land that was worth many thousands. When told that the church could not pay so much, he offered it for 57 cents.

Church members made large donations. Checks came from far and wide. Within five years the little girl's gift had increased to \$250,000.00 - a huge sum for that time (near the turn of the century). Her unselfish love had paid a large dividend.

When you are in the city of Philadelphia, look up Temple Baptist Church, with a seating capacity of 3,300 and Temple University, where hundreds of students are trained. Have a look too, at the Samaritan Hospital and at a Sunday School building which houses hundreds of Sunday Schoolers, so that no child in the area will ever need to be left outside during Sunday School time.

In one of the rooms of this building may be seen the picture of the sweet face of the little girl whose 57 cents, so sacrificially saved, made such remarkable history. Alongside of it is a portrait of her kind pastor, Dr. Russel H. Cornwell, author of the book, "Acres of Diamonds."

SCAA HALL OF FAME

The following has been taken from the SCAA
Constitution and By-Laws
SCAA Hall of Fame (September, 2001)

1. Yearly, during the board of directors meeting an SCAA past or present member may be voted into the SCAA Hall of Fame.
2. Hall of Fame Committee will consist of the SCAA Executive Board and a voting member of a chartered SCAA club.
3. The SCAA Secretary shall keep a listing of all persons nominated and accepted into the "South Carolina Archery Association Hall of Fame."
4. **NOMINATIONS** may come from any active SCAA member and must be received by the president or any member of the Executive Board Committee no later than September 15th of voting year for consideration and acceptance into the "Hall" for that calendar year. The final decision will be made by a vote of the Board of Directors during the September / October Board of Directors meeting. A 2/3-majority secret ballot vote shall be required for the nominee to be voted into the Hall of Fame.
 - a. An essay must accompany nominations; resume and any other documentation available, which would help, justify consideration and acceptance of the nominee. The nomination must also be signed by at least three other SCAA members upon being submitted to the Executive Board for consideration.
5. **MEMBERSHIP IN THE "HALL OF FAME"** There shall be three "classes" or categorical requirements for membership
 - a. "Pioneer" An archer who has been deeply involved in tournament archery since the early years of the SCAA or an archer who has implemented improvements and changes that have resulted in a positive improvement to the SCAA.
 - b. "Service" The number of years as a member of the SCAA/NFAA and has been a role model for others. An archer must be a member of the SCAA and NFAA for a

minimum of 10 years to be eligible for service.

- c. "Tournament Accomplishments." An archer who has excelled in the class that he or she competes
6. **LISTINGS** will be maintained by the SCAA Secretary and will be published periodically in the "Quiver" and the SCAA Web Sites.
7. Awards will be presented to new inductees into the "Hall" during an Awards Banquet or other official function of the SCAA as dictated by the Executive Board. These awards may take the form of a certificate or plaque, as deemed appropriate by the Executive Board. The design and wording shall be standardized and approved by the Executive Board of the SCAA.

State Championship Note

1. To be eligible to be a Class Champion you must shoot and have a score of a minimum of 7 of the State Championship Tournaments in that class. If you shoot 8 you may drop your lowest score or if you shoot all 9 you can drop your lowest 2 scores.
2. All State Championship shoots fees will be \$17.00 per person, Pee Wee and Cubs are Free
3. All scores will be ratio to a standard score of 900 for each event.
4. **State 3-D champion will be determined by the total score. You must shoot in all three to be eligible. (NEW)**

General Notes

1. All shoots will have a Pro Division (Freestyle and Freestyle Limited)
2. All shoots will have a Money Class Shoot what you bring. Entry fee will be left up to the host club
