We run two days, so everyone has a chance to attend.

In 2003 South Carolina is hosting two NFAA Southeastern Sectional events. March 1-2 Sandune will be hosting the Marked Yardage 3-D. TWO-DAY event. 25 targets each day, must shoot both days. Look in the NFAA magazine for registration forms and details.

Sandune hosted the same event last year and had a great shoot. The turnout from South Carolina wasn't what they expected, only 26 or so, but they are hoping that out of 250+ members, to get lots more this year. Try to be one of them. Keowee has always had one of the best Field ranges anywhere, if you don't should field events, you should get ready for this one. Marked

yardage, no excuses for being 3-5 yards off. Field archery gives you a full day of shooting and challenges 3-D never offers. Try it, you may find a whole new respect for archery.

For the members who do not know me, I plan on attending the shoots and mixing and talking to most of you. If you have questions or suggestions call me, e-mail me. Or walk up to me at shoots. I will try to help in anyway I can. SCAA is "our" group. And it can only get better with "our" participation. I will do my part, how about all of you.

**New for 2003**

In the fall 2002 board meeting it was decided to eliminate the three rounds of state 3-D tournaments and combine it into 1 shoot. Starting this year we will be hosting 1 3-D State Championship not 3 as in past years and it will be a **40 target course**..

**Archer of the Year Points**

Due to the elimination of two rounds of 3-D., we need to the number of tournaments for Archer of the Year. This year we will count 7 tournaments instead of the 9 that was in 2002. You must compete in a minimum of 6 tournaments instead of
