Sandune Archery would like to take this space to Thank All the Archers who supported us in the Southeastern NFAA marked Yardage 3-D. For the people who did not attend you missed a great shoot. Ask anyone who did attend, it was probably the smoothest run event in a long time. People in our Club did an outstanding job. They made this happen. As you all know help with events is one of the hardest things to get. Sandune is blessed with great help. It was held at our Club March 23-24. The weather was perfect and the facilities were in the best

of shape. We had a good attendance, but not what it could have been. We should have been a little further away from Easter week. We had around 30 South Carolina shooters, out of the 74 who attended. That number surprised us. We were looking for more SCAA shooters. We had several winners from SCAA. The winners gallery is posted on our web page @ www.scbeach/sandunearchery/. Results and scores are posted there as well. Personally I wanted to ask the membership a question. What do you want as a shooter? We hear all kinds of reasons for not going to shoots.
