Club members introduced themselves

Dan Grinolds noted his appreciation of 3 bowmen for returning to the SCAA

Bowmasters inquired about joining but was not present

Comments by Dale Smith:

Stressed importance of input from club directors

New items of information:

Indoor nationals on KY. Need to make this a big shoot and need support. Working on vendors presence and bringing in an archery show.

Sectional indoor in Georgia. Sectional 3-D in MB. Sectional Field in Florida

ASA Shoot in MB

New Club and new pro shop. Greg has shop with 15 lane indoor range.

Need to vote in three bowmen

Motion made and seconded. Carried by Unanimous vote. Will set up calendar year charter.

Minnesota state archery association has a problem. Has a problem with NFAA keeping money from memberships. Having shoots with their own targets but giving NFAA patches regardless of membership.

Annual meeting in Las Vegas along with world archery festival.

Purpose is to make money for NFAA so it was set up as a separate company as not to interfere with non-profit status. Same a 900 round at Atlantic City. Looking to move that shoot to another location with better access. NFAA has earmarked money to support bowhunter rights.

Ted Nugent has come to NFAA to sell out his World Bowhunter assoc. with approx. 16,000 members. NFAA is in negotiations to merge.

Open for questions:

Question asked about new 3d rules and about procedure for clubs to get copies of new rulebooks when they come out. New 3D rules to be discussed in new business.

Raffle tickets for shoot of a lifetime are still available for \$5 a piece 6 for \$25.

Asked members to make sure 1st and 2nd shoots are marked and urged to try to keep same weekends as last year.

Reminded club officers that it is a requirement of them to be members of the NFAA/SCAA.

Minutes of 2002 October meeting read by Randy Lawson and accepted as information.

\$112.00 written for food for this meeting

Check for \$1,123.65 given to Jerry Williams to establish account for SCAA awards banquet

Bowmasters left the SCAA not in good standing and must resolve this before reentering the association

The original 3 bowmen club did not leave the SCAA in good standing. However, this will not affect the current club as the leadership is different.

Lake Marion fulfilled their obligations and has left in good standing.

Plaque presented by Dan Grinolds to Randy Lawson for six outstanding years of service.

Old Business:

Member book- see no problem with having book similar to Western Carolina circuit. Other option is to buy page in existing book.

Beth Anctil motioned that the SCAA spend \$75 for a full ad in the Western Carolina Archery Guidebook. Kitty Stewart second.

Question asked about representation. Al Brandon will represent.

Passed without opposition.

Clubs who want to do advertise as well are urged to do so.

Trophies and plaques from previous shoots are in the back.

Feedback was solicited on having only one state 3-D championship. General consensus was that we need to have more than one.

Fred Connors from Lake Marion was asked if anything can be done about them remaining in the SCAA.

Lake Marion was concerned with NFAA stand on crossbows.

Dale Smith stated that the NFAA does not support cross bows. Cross Bow shooters paid to compete at the World Archery shoots.

SCBA Update:

Additional Shoot – Stated that Georgia traditional shoot in 2004 will be last there last so they are planning a March 19-21 Traditional Shoot at Rocks Pond.

Annual Rocks Pond Shoot will be 23-25 April.

Motion by Emmett Tyree to move State Hunter to June 5-6 to support SCBA Rocks Pond.

Second by Bobby Forester. Passed without opposition.

Clubs were urged to have SCBA applications at their shoots

SCBA has Bowhunter education classes available to have at your clubs.

Randy Lawson discussed awards and records program. Records being kept for many species.

Awards – Big Buck divided into 1st, 2nd, 3rd as well as doe, bear, hog, and fish awards.

Membership is only 340 members out of an estimated 40,000 bowhunters in SC

New Business:

Bryan Huntley – Motion that an alternate date be set just in case a state shoot has to be cancelled.

Date will be determined after schedule is set. Second by Sam Stewart.

Passed without opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion to rename American round to 900 round to comply with NFAA

rulebook. Second by Emmett Tyree. Passed without opposition.

Bryan Huntley - Motion to have SCAA handbook drafted. Second by Frank Kimbrell. Passed without opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion to adopt NFAA 3d classes and rules. Second by Perry Burns. Passed without opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion to add Bowhunter class on state level only. Second by Perry Burns.

Passed without opposition.

Agreed that awards for bowhunters optional but highly encouraged..

Bryan Huntley – Motion to standardize on 5 stakes of 20, 25, 35, 40, 45 yards. Second by Sam Stewart. Passed without opposition.

Kitty Stewart - Motion to set stake colors – 45-orange 40-green 35-yellow, 25-white , blue-20
Second by Frank Kimbrell. Passed without opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion to set Max. distances. Second by Frank Kimbrell. Passed without
opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion to put Bowhunter stake in center line with option of club to put in
tough man. Second by David Shull Passed without opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion that each club have a designated shoot as a 3-D state championship.
This will count towards shooter of the year. Second by Perry Burns. Passed without opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion that to be in contention for shooter of the year a shooter must shoot in a
least 50% of the field events and 50% of the 3-D events. Second by Emmett Tyree. Passed
without opposition.

Bryan Huntley – Motion that state 3-D shoot be 30 targets. Count top 4 for state 3-D champion.
Second by Bob Merck. Passed without opposition.

Agreed that shooters must shoot in a comparable class.

Question about if SCBA needs a contribution. David Schull stated that they could use additional
monies due to extra money spent. Perry Burns motioned that we donate \$500 to the SCBA
Second by Bryan Huntley. Passed without opposition.
