**FROM THE PRESIDENT

Fellow SCAA Members,

As the 2003 season slows down, it is time to look forward to the shoots in 2004. Members should know that clubs belonging in the SCAA bid for these shoot dates.

Its not as simple as saying let's shoot this weekend, it takes the time and effort of all clubs to get dates and times set. The meeting for setting dates is October 19, 2003 at Lexington. All clubs should have a representative or two at that meeting.

The SCAA is ready and willing to work with any club, old or new who wants to get into the SCAA. We want to encourage any archer, club, other groups to look at us and see if we can work together to make archery in South Carolina grow. We may be known as a NFAA spot shooters group, but as everyone knows 3-D is the place to be in archery. We have 3-D and know where the shooters are, but lots of them don't seem to know us. Spot shooting is also a great time. Maybe a little more work but still fun. Give it a try.

Unfortunately we lost a SCAA club this year and we really hated to see them go. I hope that some of the club's members will continue on in SCAA and NFAA.

In the past two years Sandune Archery Club has offered a Sectional 3-D marked yardage shoot and Keowee Bowmen this year had the Sectional Field event.

The Keowee club's SE Field course and the club itself was in great shape and they ran a smooth shoot. They earned a great deal of praise from all the archers who attended. Both of these events were successful but they could have been better attended. There should be much better attendance from our 200 plus membership. The Keowee shoot had 26 South Carolina shooters, that is 10% of SCAA membership. Sandune had about 35 South Carolina shooters, still poor. What is the reason for this? Your guess is as good as anybody else. I have heard all kinds of things and I am at a loss on how to try to change it. It

would be great if members would contribute ideas and suggestions, but that seems to be unheard of. All clubs are open

to suggestions and ideas and help is needed to keep things running. Do you know what changes could be made to encourage better attendance? Sandune has bid and successfully gotten the NFAA SE 3-D again for 2004, and I would like to challenge all members to come out, if we had 40-50% of the members show up, the shoot would be best attended in years. It is going to be 20-20-20 this time with 20 on Saturday morning and 20 Saturday afternoon, and the final 20 on Sunday morning. All marked yardage. MUST SHOOT BOTH DAYS. April 17-18, the week after Easter. We are working on rooms and rates. A flyer will be sent to all SCAA members. We look forward to seeing ALL your smiling faces. We know we cannot make people shoot, we cannot beg people to shoot. We tried all that and nothing works. From this perspective I have two questions: WHAT DO YOU WANT FROM SCAA? WHAT RE YOU WILLING TO CONTRIBUTE FOR SUCCESSFUL EVENTS IN SC? This past weekend was the first time this year someone came up and asked what can we do to make SCAA better. They also asked why SC has two archery groups? When 90% of people belong to both and they seem to be pulling archers in different directions? Good question! SCAA and SCBA do work together and will continue to push for archers in SC to be well represented. We need to be more united in our goals, suggestions are welcome for this. I look forward to seeing you at the Oct. 19 meeting with your suggestions and ideas. If you are unable to attend but have something you would like to contribute, please contact me. The 2004 season looks to be a promising year in SC archery.

As you know I have not shot a tournament since the Vegas in 2002.

As many of you know, I have been actively involved in the SCBA. This has taken some time that I have in the past devoted to tournament archery along with other family oriented activities.

Even though I have been a part of the SCAA the last 10 years I have never really voiced my concern of the welfare of the organization. It will survive for that I am sure. I only hope that others within the association get more involved. My case in point is that

there has been a number of letters and notes that an archer in the SCAA wants more of something but we are unsure of what it is. I have heard and seen for my self that SCAA archers do not support clubs that have scheduled tournaments, weekly, or state excusive scheduled tournaments. Over the last three years, I have compiled numbers that reflect the number of shooters that attend our tournaments. These numbers have been taken from the attendance forms host clubs are required to submit to the secretary. Near 65% of the shooters that attend a club event are NON SCAA members. Another way of putting it is, based on 100 shooters only 35 out of every 100 SCAA members attends a shoot on a weekend. As I stated earlier I am one that is guilty of not shooting.

The next point I would like to make is the numbers of volunteers or nominations for the offices for annual elections. I would like to express my thanks to all the local clubs officers. The time and dedication it takes to perform these roles is time consuming and we all should express our thanks to you for the jobs that you do.. Now for the rest of you, it is time to get involved. In the last 6 years, we have had a number of elections in the SCAA. In those elections normally two or three positions each year there are no more than one nominee for each office. This year is no exception. We had one for Secretary/Treasurer, one for Vice-President and no one for Quiver Editor. Let's be honest with ourselves. That is pathetic.

In closing, I just want to extend my thanks to all of you that made my job a pleasant one and I am looking forward to seeing you again.
